Make sure you have read the Katy ISD FFA Livestock Show Handbook carefully so that you are aware of the requirements.

Requirements to Show

- B. Student <u>cannot</u> have <u>any</u> unexcused absences from FFA meetings beginning with the first regular meeting of September through the <u>completion</u> of the school year.

FFA MEETINGS WILL BE HELD AT 3:00 PM IN THE LGI.

- C. Students must participate in fundraising activities (catalog ad sales and the River star Farms Fundraiser) and sell a minimum of \$500 total.
 - a. Minimum requirements for ad sales to remain a member of good standing:
 - i. Sell at least one-half page ad

Livestock Show Rules Highlights **Please make sure to read the Livestock Show Rules in their entirety on your own! **

- 1. No pass/No Play is in effect and does apply to the Livestock Show requirements.
- 2. Must pass all classes during the 3rd six weeks & if a student fails any class during the 3rd six weeks they must pass all classes on the 4th six weeks progress report to be eligible to show.
- 3. Students are ineligible to show if they are suspended from school or place in OAC. Any student placed in ISS for more than 3 days or more than one time during the year is ineligible to show.
- 4. 114 of the livestock entries exhibited by individual FFA members will qualify for the premium auction. The judge of each species will set sale order. Grand and Reserve Grand champions will sell automatically. The remainder of the sale lots will be filled by the set show rules. Please refer to the show rules packet. Only 10 rabbits will be sold.

The LIVESTOCK SHOW BEGINS ON Tuesday, February 14th. Students are required to be in attendance for all meetings through Saturday February 18th. A student who misses a required chapter meeting during the Livestock show will be fined \$25 each time.

Students will only receive excused absences during the Livestock Show by species and/or Teacher Approval. Students need to make arrangements to make sure their animal is taken care of on the other days of the Livestock Show before and after school.

All money & paperwork will be paid online through pay and go. There will be no in-person payments this year.

**Students are responsible for checking the newsletter & Remind for all announcements, important dates & information regarding their species. You must also sign in at all meetings and practices to verify attendance. **



All numbers will be drawn Friday afternoon at the Ag facility from 3:00-4:00 pm. It is first come first serve basis.

Preview will be from 5:30 - 6:00 PM if you are interested in attending. This is our only time slot to preview.

No one is allowed in the selection area except for the student and Ag Science teacher

Pig:

Selection begins at 7:30 am at Ag facility YOU MUST CHECK IN WITH MS. L OR MR. M WHEN YOU ARRIVE.

Sheep:

Selection begins at 11:00 AM YOU MUST CHECK WITH MRS. BURTON OR MS. SIERRA WHEN YOU ARRIVE. **Bring your halter with you.**

Goat:

Selection begins at 1:00 PM at the Ag facility.
YOU MUST CHECK WITH MS. SIERRA OR MRS. BURTON WHEN YOU ARRIVE.

Each pick will be held at the Gerald D. Young Agricultural Facility on Katy/Hockley and Beckendorff Rd.

ALL STUDENTS MUST STAY IN THE SHOW ARENA UNTIL YOUR NUMBER IS CALLED.

Progress Show

December 8th & 9th

All exhibitors are required to show in the progress show. It is not an option. Failure to show at the progress show can make you ineligible for the main show in February.

UIL Rules apply to both shows. Progress show is based on the 2nd six weeks report card.

Katy ISD Progress Show exhibitors must exhibit their projects in the progress show shirt, jeans/pants that are free of holes, and must wear closed toe footwear. (Page 10 in Katy ISD Livestock Handbook)

Showmanship Clinic

We will have a showmanship clinic at the barn **tentatively** scheduled for the week of November 14th but may change. Please be flexible, you will have advanced notice.

We will have a guest judge to help with showmanship. This will be a mandatory event for all animal raisers. (excluding chickens & rabbits)

So, students are prepared to show before winter break for the progress show.

Fundraising

Participation is required for KISD Livestock Show participants, FFA Officers, & FFA Members to earn an FFA Jacket. All members are encouraged to participate in fundraising activities.

Catalog Ad Sales:

Begin: August 31st, 2022 Ends: September 22th, 2022

Riverstar Farms Fundraising:

Begin: October 3rd, 2022 End: November 3rd, 2022

Students must sell at least 1 half page to remain a member of good standing.

Ad books are distributed to students in February to give to people who bought an ad (larger than a business card). Students must return a signature sheet to their ag teacher showing that each ad book was delivered. **If this sheet is not returned by the due** date, there is a fine of \$25/day.

Students must sell a minimum of 10 items from the River Star Fundraiser

Ad Sales fundraiser will be held though pay n go. & The River Star Farms fundraiser will be via the Riverstar Website. No checks or cash accepted.

Exhibitors must sell a combination of \$500 between both fundraisers to be eligible for the show.

Officers must sell \$1000 total.

Fundraising buckles (\$1000) must be earned in one or the other. They cannot be combined.

Thank You Notes & Picture Delivery

Thank You Notes:

All students who sell an animal in the Livestock show will be required to write a thank you note to the buyer(s). In order to make letters and notes more personal, students should hand write each letter. This is preferred by buyers and demonstrates that you took time to custom write each thank you note. THIS DOES MAKE A DIFFERENCE!

All students who catch a calf or receive a hard luck calf in the KISD Calf Scramble must also write thank you notes to their sponsor.

All thank you letters must meet the following guidelines when turned in:

- Stamped, Addressed unsealed envelope
- Written in Pen
- Turned in by 2:35 on the due date completed. Missing stamps, envelopes, or submitting a poorly written or unreadable thank you note counts as incomplete. Student must fix the problem before the thank you letters are accepted.
- Suggestion: You may want to buy thank you cards to write you letters in. You can find these at the dollar store inexpensively.

ALL THANK YOU NOTES FOR KISD LIVESTOCK SHOW ARE DUE APRIL 1ST 2022.

Failure to meet this deadline will result in a late penalty of \$25/day and delayed livestock show checks. (See #16 under general rules in KISD Livestock Show Rules)

Calf Scramble participants will receive information on their thank you note due night at the time of their scramble. If you have questions get with your ag teacher.

Picture Delivery

Each student who sells in the live auction will be given copies of the buyer photo. This student must purchase a frame for the picture and deliver it to the buyer. They must return the signature sheet stating that the buyer received the picture by the due date which is 2 weeks following receipt of the picture. **Failure to meet this deadline will result in a late penalty of \$25 per day.** (see #14 under General Rules

Chicken & Rabbit Feeders

Those whose buyers request the animals are responsible for delivery. They much check with their Ag Teacher the following Monday after the show to see if they need to deliver product to the buyer.

Official Dress

The FFA Association is unique in that we have an official dress that stands for unity in our organization. The corduroy jacket FFA members wear dates back to the 1933 national convention where it was first established. The FFA Official Dress standards were created at the 1973 convention. Since this time, the official dress has been worn by FFA function around the world. When others see our members in official dress they realize that we belong to one of the largest youth led organizations in the world. Therefore, it is important that each member understand and wear the correct official dress while participating in official activities.

Remember that it is an honor to wear the blue corduroy jacket and the official dress representing the legacy of the FFA. Wear it properly-and with pride

Girls:

- Black skirt –skirt is to be at least knee length, hemmed evenly across the button, with a slit
 no longer than 2 inches above the knee, excluding the kick pleat.
- White collared blouse & official FFA blue scarf
- Black dress shoe with a closed heel & toe (no boots, sandals, open toed shoes, tennis shoes)
- Black nylon hosiery
- Official FFA Jacket zipped to the top
- No facial piercings or unnatural colored hair (blue, pink, etc)
- Black jeans and boots are appropriate for the KISD Livestock Show
 - No bling or distracting decorations on jeans are permitted

Guys:

- Black pants (no jeans-blue, leather, pleather, etc)
- White dress shirt & Official FFA tie
- Black Dress shoes with a closed heel and toe or boots
- Official FFA jacket zipped to the top
- Black jeans and boots are appropriate for the KISD Livestock Show
- No facial hair. Hair should be cut short enough to not touch the ears or back of your collar.

Proper Use of the Jacket:

- 1. The jacket is to be worn only by members
- 2. The jacket should be kept clean and neat
- 3. The back of the jacket should only have a large official FFA emblem, the name of the state and the name of the local chapter, region, district or area. The front of the jacket should have only the a small official FFA emblem, the name of the individual, once office or honor and the year of that office or honor.
- 4. The jacket should be worn only on official occasions with the zipper fastened at the top. The color should be turned down and the cuffs buttoned.
- 5. The jacket can only be worn with complete official dress.
- 6. The jacket should only be worn to places that are appropriate for the members to visit.
- 7. School letters and insignia of other organizations should not be attached or worn on the jacket.
- 8. School letters and insignia of other organizations should be discarded or the emblems and lettering removed.
- 9. The emblems and lettering should be removed if the jacket is given or sold to a non-member.
- 10. A member should act professionally when wearing the FFA jacket.
- 11. All chapter degree, officer and award medals should be worn beneath the name on the right side of the jacket, with the exception that a single state FFA degree charm or American FFA degree key should be worn above the name or attached to a standard key chain. No more than 3 medals should be worn on the jacket. These should represent the highest degree earned, the highest office held, and the highest award earned by the member.

Agricultural Science Facility Regulations Agreement

The purpose of the Katy ISD Agricultural facility located at Katy-Hockley Road and Beckendorff Road is to provide an extension of the classroom to be utilized for the students' Supervised Agricultural Experience Programs (SAEP). For student convenience, Katy ISD will provide morning bus service to and from the facility originating at each high school campus and returning to that same campus. This bus service will be provided starting the first-class day of Katy ISD schools and end the day after the Katy ISD Livestock Show and Sale annually. On days that students ride the bus, they are expected to ride both to and from the project center unless pre-approval is granted by the AST. Katy ISD Student Code of Conduct applies as it relates to bus privileges.

In order for all parties to best utilize the Agricultural Science facilities and to ensure the safety of the students, animals, and others on the property, the following regulations must be followed. To ensure compliance, Katy ISD employees including Agricultural Science Teachers and school administrators, will monitor compliance of facility regulations and the operations of the facility.

Based on the respect for each schools' traditions, standards, and expectations, the rules and guidelines have been established by Katy ISD. Due to the uniqueness of the individual schools and the needs of the individual students, the individual Agricultural Science Teachers (AST) may make decisions based on the best interest of the District, the school, the student and the animal(s).

All participants will comply with the following regulations and criteria.

- 1. As a Katy ISD facility supporting school-related activities, the most recent <u>Katy ISD</u> <u>Student Handbook</u> and the <u>Katy ISD Discipline Management Plan and Student Code of Conduct</u> will apply.
- 2. For security purposes, the facility will be open between 5:00 AM and 9:00 PM.
- 3. The Agricultural Science Teachers will monitor all guidelines and criteria closely. Ethical and humane treatment of animals and violation of regulations will not be compromised and the offense period outlined below will apply.
- 4. The student must be a dues paying Katy ISD FFA member in good standing to utilize the facility. *Guests must have prior permission to enter the complex.* The student is responsible for his/her family and guest(s) at all times. If the guest violates the rules of the Agricultural Science Facility, it will be treated as though the student violated the rules.
- 5. Drive and park in designated areas. Students and parents may use either entrance or park in the **FRONT** parking lot only. The back of the barns are for unloading and emergency parking only.
- 6. Keep animal pen(s) clean at all times. Any animal not fed, watered, and cared for daily will be removed from the facility at the owner's expense. Steps followed when failure to maintain proper care of pen area and animal care are:
 - *First offense The student will receive a letter from the AST, which constitutes a warning, and the problem must be remedied within two (2) days of letter's date to the satisfaction of the Agricultural Science Teacher. The letter will be signed by both the student and the parent, and filed in the CTE office of Katy ISD. A copy of the letter will be made available to the campus administrator of the student.
 - *Second Offense Will follow the same steps as above, but will be considered a final warning.
 - *Third Offense The student will be evicted from the facility and the animal will be removed from the premises at the owner's expense.
 - *Fourth Offense If the animal has not been removed from the barn within 72 hours of having been served an eviction notice via certified mail, the animal will be sold at auction. If the animal was sponsored by a scramble or non-profit organization, any

residual funds (after all outstanding dues and fees are paid) shall be returned to that organization. If the animal was not purchased by a scramble or non-profit organization, any residual funds (after outstanding dues and fees are paid) shall be donated to the student's FFA chapter.

- 7. Students will provide their own animal care equipment.
- 8. No male breeding animals are allowed at the facility. Heifers no longer eligible to compete at approved shows must be removed from the facility within two weeks after the last show for which they are eligible to compete.
- 9. If a student becomes ineligible to show, he or she will have 10 days, from the day they became ineligible, to remove his or her animal from the ag facility.
- 10. If a student is evicted from the facility, he/she will not be allowed back on the premises.
- 11. All manure and feedstuffs must be properly disposed of in the approved designated areas.
- 12. Tack rooms are to be kept neat and clean. No hay will be allowed into the tack rooms. Any valuables are suggested to be brought to and from home as needed. The school district and its employees are not responsible for theft or damage. Students will not be permitted to bring in tack not approved by the Agricultural Science Teacher. The safety, sanitation, and the appearance of the barn are a priority.
- 13. The student is responsible for cleaning and maintaining the project area (e.g. pen) at all times. No modifications may be made to the existing structure. At certain times of the year, students may be required to clean their project area and assist others in cleaning the facility as a whole.
- 14. Priority for space will be given to Katy ISD FFA show animals.
- 15. A student may have no more than 4 animals at the facility at one time.
- 16. All students' projects are under the direct supervision of their Agricultural Science Teacher.
- 17. The use of power equipment such as tractors, bobcats, other front-end loader, etc. by students is NOT allowed at the facility.
- 18. Pen rent must be paid in full prior to placing the animal at the facility at a rate of \$20.00 per month.
- 19. No heat lamps are allowed in the barns at any time.
- 20. Projects must be related to FFA. No 4-H projects. Jr. FFA projects may be housed at the discretion of the AST, based on pen availability.

The animals listed below may be kept at the facility:

Junior Show Hogs Junior Show Lambs
Junior Show Goats Junior Show Steers

- 21. Remove animals, clean pen out within two (2) weeks after exhibiting the animal at the designated show. If a student does not clean out the pen within two weeks, a fine of \$50.00 will be assessed for not cleaning the pen. The student will not be allowed to stall an animal at the facility the following year.
- 22. Animals are to be washed in designated areas only.
- 23. At ALL TIMES, students are to remain in their designated barn. AT NO TIME, are students allowed in other high school barns unless asked to do so by an AST.
- 24. Students will be required to purchase two security cards at the rate of \$5.00 each. Each card after the initial two cards have been purchased may be replaced for \$5.00 each. All exhibitor cards will be deactivated after the Katy ISD Livestock Show annually, and re-activated as needed.

- 25. The student is to respect the value of the Katy ISD Agricultural Science Facility. Any defacing of property or equipment will mean dismissal from the complex IMMEDIATELY.
- 26. Passageways, including door openings, are not to be cluttered with boxes, equipment or animals. Both routine and emergency traffic must be able to move efficiently.
- 27. All broken or stolen equipment is to be reported immediately. All equipment is to be cleaned and returned to the proper storage area after each use. All wheelbarrows WILL be emptied after each use.
- 28. No glass containers are allowed at the barn complex. Broken glass can cause severe damage to a student or project.
- 29. No pets are allowed at the barn.
- 30. Upon graduation, students will no longer have use of the project facility.
- 31. Neither KATY ISD, Cinco Ranch High School FFA and Booster Club, Katy High School FFA and Booster Club, Mayde Creek High School FFA and Booster Club, Morton Ranch High School FFA and Booster Club, Taylor High School FFA and Booster Club, Seven Lakes FFA and Booster Club, Tompkins High School FFA and Booster Club or the Katy ISD Agricultural Science Teachers nor any school official will be responsible for injury to or death of any project animal while it is on school property or any other property.

2022-2023 Mayde Creek High School Addendum

Additions to Katy ISD Facilities Rules

Rule 1:

- Tobacco (dip, snuff, chew etc.) or any other tobacco products (cigarettes, vapor pens, etc.) are NOT allowed in the barn. Anyone in possession of items will be subject to loss of points, school punishment, and/or possible eviction.
- Alcoholic beverages, controlled substances, and/or firearms are not allowed at any time. Any student or parent in possession of these items will have their project evicted.

Rule 4:

- STUDENT MUST HAVE TEACHER APPROVAL TO RAISE IN THE BARN.
- Only FFA members that currently have an animal in the barn, and their immediate family (i.e. Mother, Father, Sibling, Step-parent, or Guardian) are allowed at the farm. All other guests must receive prior approval from an Ag Teacher.
- Student is responsible for any family member or friend that breaks the stated rule.

Rule 6:

- Prior approval must be received from the Ag Teacher for someone else to feed/water your animal.
- Food & water are considered daily care, and if neglected it is considered abuse and can result in disciplinary action or eviction.

Rule 13:

- Any and all feces or other organic waste must be removed from pen daily.
- Any and all wet sand/dirt/shavings/ or bedding must be removed morning and night.
- Any and all wheel barrows, poop buckets, regular buckets, feed sacks or other containers must remain empty of all feces or organic waste at all times.
- Any and all areas of the farm must remain trash free at all time.
- Rakes, shovels, poop scoops, etc. must be hung or stored properly at all times.
- Any feces placed or located in the aisle or around your pen is your responsibility.
- If you are caught throwing feces, organic waste, trash or any other materials in or around another person's pen this will be cause for immediate eviction.
- If you are caught inside another person's pen without permission, it is cause for immediate removal.
- You are responsible for any waste your animal excretes while out of your pen in common areas.

Pig specific: Feeding Pans must be clipped to a feeding panel at all times. No pallets, buckets, or ball are permitted. Shavings only in pens.

• Concrete must remain clean in front of your pen at all times.

Additional Rules:

- 1. All stall/pen assignments will be done by the Ag teachers and should not be moved without prior approval.
- 2. Student must administer any prescribed medications when advised by the teacher if failure to do so would affect health of other student's projects.
- 3. Students are expected to help with general cleaning of the barn on designed weeks.
- 4. Feed bags are not to be put into trashcans inside the barn but taken to the dumpster.
- 5. Parking- Only gate accessible to students and parents is the main entrance off of Katy/Hockley Rd. Students and parents are only allowed to park in front parking lot or back parking lot behind second row of barns. There will be no access to enter to the middle parking area.
